Free Software inside the EP

Tmail and infrastructure

Users: 6 in total, 4 active (and growing)

Firefox and other client software

Users: Not (yet) allowed in standard config.

Mailing lists

... and other obscurities of the europa! infrastructure

- ▶ Exchange with only OWA access enabled (but without restrictions).
 - ▶ Enabling the Tmail service.
- ▶ Fuzzy retention rules for inboxes (> 90 days gets removed from Inboxes... mostly :).
- ▶ Does not allow spoofed @europa.eu e-mail addresses (stopping most mailing lists).
 - ▶ Solved by the percent-hack in exim, used by `act-on@acta.eu`, `@mypnr.eu` (mailman) and `@epfsug.eu` (sympa).



Free Software and Open Data

- ▶ The EP should **keep improving** the quality of the data it makes available to the public, in particular with regards to **time and date accuracy**.
- ▶ The EP should continue to **ensure** that data is made available in formats and through interfaces which enable **free and easy access and processing** of the data.
- ▶ The EP should **avoid** investing in software and services which leads to **"lock in" of citizens and risk the institution's vendor independence, also with respect to social media**.
- ▶ The EP should **develop strategies for making its data available for all to use and reuse** as per existing best practises for opening up of public sector data.

EPFSUG wants to

- ▶ **Assist** people interested in using free software in the EP.
- ▶ **Drive adoption** of free software in the EP's information infrastructure.
- ▶ Push for the use of **open standards**, to ensure equal access for citizens using free software.
- ▶ Work in cooperation with like-minded groups in Europe and around the world.
