Open Source's History

One of the first tasks undertaken by OSI was to draft the Open Source Definition (OSD), derived from the Debian Free Software Guidelines (DFSG):

- 1. Free Redistribution
- 2. Source Code
- 3. Derived Works
- 4. Integrity of The Author's Source Code
- 5. No Discrimination Against Persons or Groups
- 6. No Discrimination Against Fields of Endeavor
- 7. Distribution of License
- 8. License Must Not Be Specific to a Product
- 9. License Must Not Restrict Other Software
- 10. License Must Be Technology-Neutral



Free Software's History

Origins

The DFSG was inspired by the Free Software Definition:

- 1. The freedom to run the program as you wish, for any purpose
- 2. The freedom to study how the program works, and change it so it does your computing as you wish
- 3. The freedom to redistribute copies so you can help your neighbor
- 4. The freedom to distribute copies of your modified versions to others
