Some background 1/2



- Organisations whatever their size and shape do use open source.
 In their critical processes and assets, products, and daily operations.
- Many organisations have no clue about what open source is, how to use it, or what are the duties and responsibilities that come with it.
 Well, some just don't care, true. But many actually just don't know.
- Like any entity, they can (should) **contribute to its ecosystem** with TLC, code, doc, support, funding..
- ⇒ The OSPO Alliance aims to help them do the right thing.

Some background 2/2



- Usage help them understand what it is, how to properly and safely use it.
 - Legal, Intellectual Property, in-house knowledge and skills, security management...
- Contribute to ensure evolution and maintenance of dependencies, processes, products. And to be a good citizen.
 - Enable and encourage contributions from employees, engage with open source projects, contribute upstream.
- Participate to foster the community and sustain the ecosystem on the long term.
 - Engage with the community and ecosystem, fund initiatives and projects, promote open source.

The OSPO Alliance



- Launched in 2021 by European non-profit organisations to promote best practices in open source software management.
- Governed by open source principles: open, transparent, collaborative, meritocratic.
 Everybody is welcome, we hold regular meetings, collaborate in an open GitLab repo.
- Provides:
 - The OSPO Alliance website, forum, and community mailing list.
 - The OSPO OnRamp monthly webinars.
 - The Good Governance Handbook: a proven, actionable framework and set of guidelines and best practices for building a successful OSPO.

GGI Framework - Goals



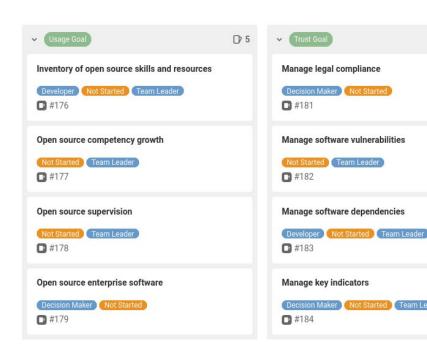
- Proposes a path to a successful OSPO, with a proven method and practical guidance:

GGI Framework - Activities



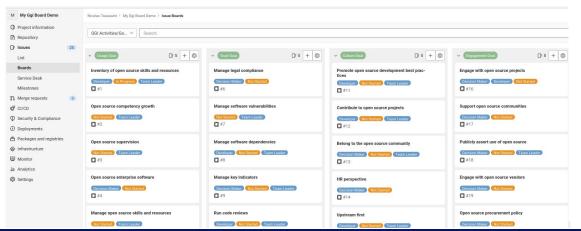
- Activities have the following structure:
 - Description
 - Opportunity Assessment
 - Progress Assessment
 - Recommendations
 - Tools & Resources
 - Recommended next steps
- Activities are meant as templates, and need to be translated to the local context through Scorecards, which enable full adaptation.

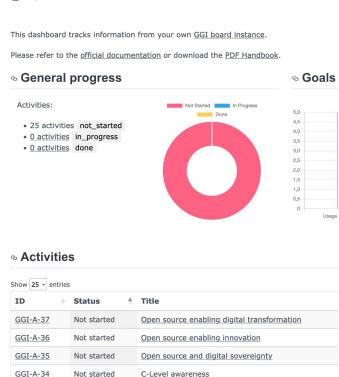


GGI - Deployment



- Easy to deploy: 10mn setup on any GitLab instance.
- Provides complete access to all GGI features: activities, scorecards, boards, and a customised dashboard to track and share progress.





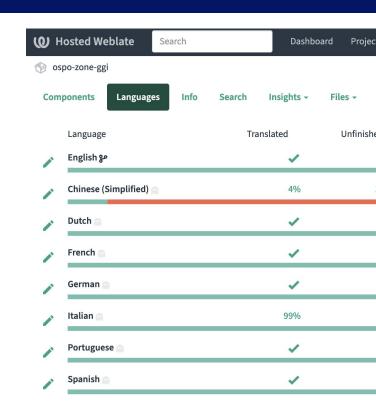
