Some background 1/2

- **Organisations** - whatever their size and shape - do **use open source**.
In their critical processes and assets, products, and daily operations.
- **Many organisations have no clue about what open source is**, how to use it, or what are the duties and responsibilities that come with it.
Well, some just don't care, true. But many actually just don't know.
- Like any entity, they can (should) **contribute to its ecosystem** with TLC, code, doc, support, funding..

⇒ **The OSPO Alliance aims to help them do the right thing.**

So we all benefit from this mutual collaboration.

Some background 2/2

- **Usage** – help them understand what it is, how to properly and safely use it.
 - Legal, Intellectual Property, in-house knowledge and skills, security management..
- **Contribute** – to ensure evolution and maintenance of dependencies, processes, products. And to be a good citizen.
 - Enable and encourage contributions from employees, engage with open source projects, contribute upstream.
- **Participate** – to foster the community and sustain the ecosystem on the long term.
 - Engage with the community and ecosystem, fund initiatives and projects, promote open source.

- Launched in 2021 by **European non-profit organisations** to promote **best practices in open source software management**.
- **Governed by open source principles**: open, transparent, collaborative, meritocratic. Everybody is welcome, we hold regular meetings, collaborate in an open GitLab repo.
- Provides:
 - The OSPO Alliance website, forum, and community mailing list.
 - The OSPO OnRamp monthly webinars.
 - The Good Governance Handbook: a proven, actionable framework and set of guidelines and best practices for building a successful OSPO.

What's new in 2023?

New in 2023:



GGI Framework - Activities


- **Activities** have the following structure:
 - Description
 - Opportunity Assessment
 - Progress Assessment
 - Recommendations
 - Tools & Resources
 - Recommended next steps
- Activities are meant as templates, and need to be translated to the local context through **Scorecards**, which enable **full adaptation**.

- Provides complete access to all GGI features: activities, scorecards, boards, and a customised dashboard to track and share progress.

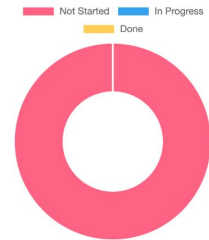

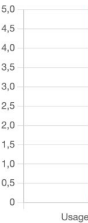
